A misunderstanding of our role in the world related to anthropocentricism where non-human animals and earth don't seem to matter



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

Desensitize and Disengage in a New Way

- Successive approximation
- · Within the context of trust
- With understanding of the horse's personal triggers

 With understanding of the horse's personal triggers
- Gradually increasing intensity

- Can be forced or over-used
- Practice within the context of trust

- Your projections can intensify this experience for the horse
